New Independence Branch Library Opens

After years of active neighborhood lobbying, the new Independence Branch of the Chicago Public Library system opened to the public on January 22. Four floors of senior housing remain under construction at the facility, located at 4022 N. Elston Avenue.

Architect John Ronan was in attendance, as were many neighborhood residents, including members of the GIPNA board, members of Old Irving Park Association and West Walker Civic Group, and members of many other community groups from the Northwest Side.

Mayor Rahm Emanuel addressed the crowd and officially opened the two-story mixed-use facility. 45th Ward Alderman John Arena, who was instrumental in getting funding from both the Chicago Public Library and Chicago Housing Authority, and 39th Ward Alderman Margaret Laurino also spoke. The \$23.6 million dollar project was funded through a partnership of the CHA and CPL system. It will feature 44 units of housing for seniors.

The library represents the combined efforts of members of GIPNA, OIPA, West Walker, and many other civic groups; aldermen Arena, Laurino, Carlos Ramirez-Rosa (35th), and Deb Mell (33rd); and State Representative Jaime Andrade. A special nod of recognition goes to Roberta Bole, who has worked tirelessly in support of the library for many, many years.

Parkview Terrace requested a zoning variance in order to build a 7-foot to 9-foot fence with 2-foot by 2-foot masonry piers at the borders of their property. They also requested a variance to build a stairway on the southern edge. The ZBA allowed the stairway. The fence failed to receive three affirmative votes.

What is the best neighborhood place to buy a bottle of wine or beer? We asked Chris Mastroanni about his go-to spots in the neighborhood. The owner of Master Johnny, Inc. gave us a few of his top spots.

"We are a bit snobby about our choices of alcohol," said IP's resident handyman. "After all, life is short."

He prefers Golden Leaf for wine,
but Irving Park Liquor for its extensive beer selection.

What type of wine does he buy?
"We prefer a moderately priced
Cabernet Sauvignon or Pinot Noir
such as Josh, Chateau Ste Michelle,
Bogle or the Michael David Freakshow Cabernet." He recommends
both stores for their selection and
their friendly staff.






