CLEARmap is a website with analysis and reporting compiled by the Chicago Police Department. It allows the public to access crime incidents, crime summaries, and listings of sex offenders and gun offenders; voice community concerns; and find block clubs. The information can be searched using an address or community area, ward, police beat or district, and around a school or park. You can also search within a custom-drawn polygon or with a name. Heating It Up With Glassmaking

One of your earliest life lessons probably went something like this: If you play with fire, you're going to get burned. However, according to Independence Park resident and glass artist Sharon Gilbert, nothing could be further from the truth.

From the moment Sharon touched hot glass, she fell under its spell. In fact, she says the art of glassblowing—which involves manipulating 2,000-degree molten glass—is downright fun.

She uses an untraditional approach, combining expertise in several warm-glass processes—blowing, fusing, and casting—to create her artwork. In blowing, she dips a five-foot-long pipe into a pot of molten glass to blow bubbles, then layers imagery and patterns into the surfaces. Fusing involves building imagery with cold pieces of colored glass on a flat plane, and then heating up the block and reshaping it. Casting uses multiple processes to work three-dimensional imagery either within the glass or into relief coming out of the glass.

Combining the processes gives Sharon an unusually wide range of possibilities for the look of the finished work. She says her goal is

to integrate her work with a client's overall design plan by designing to fit an environment, rather than stamping her own set of designs onto any given project.

Sharon has spent the last 25 years creating custom glasswork in her studio, Talisman Glass. Her work combines strong colors and textures playing off historical glass forms and usage, but the pieces are very modern. Her work, for both indoor and outdoor environments, can be seen in restaurants, churches, businesses, and homes across America.

The architectural work can combine glass with stone or metal to make up large-scale installations—anything from solid blocks with imagery in them to store displays, fountains, entry sculptures, and the colorful lighting she is known for. Sharon also makes advertising props, does prototyping for test marketing with large companies, and creates memorial keepsakes for families with remains from pets and people. While most of the work is created in collaboration with architects and interior designers, she also works with individuals directly for residential work.

Along with her business of creating custom glass, she also teaches classes to share the magic of glass and give a taste of the fun of glassblowing to the public. Check out the options on her website, www.talismanglass.com.

Robbery alert! Don't Become a Victim

The following information about how to avoid being a robbery victim was handed out at a recent CAPS meeting:

6. Be alert! Dial 911 for anything suspicious. Note the person's description, direction of flight, and vehicle, if any.
